Please can I remind those parents who are collecting younger children before collecting an older sibling to please keep your child with you to avoid compromising other bubbles or families.


Use of the School Car Park

The competition closes on Tuesday 15th December.




A few weeks ago, we celebrated Anti-Bullying week by taking part in a range of activities and online workshops run by The Diana Award.



Nursery Rhyme Week 16th to 20th November

In Nursery, Reception and Year 1 we enjoyed a week full of rhyming activities. Developing children's knowledge of rhyme, rhythm and alliteration is vital in the beginning stages of reading. We explored a variety of classic Nursery Rhymes such as, Humpty Dumpty, Baa Baa Black Sheep and The Wheels on the Bus.

Within the Nursery the children used props and masks to sing and explore a variety of Nursery Rhymes. In the garden they spent time acting out Humpty Dumpty. They were able to sing a

variety of Nursery Rhymes and were starting to fill in the gaps to match the rhyming words. "There's a worm at the bottom of the Garden" became a class favourite– resulting in a big dig for worms!



Reception explored Miss Molly had a Dolly and decided to make Get Well Soon cards for the Dolly. Whilst singing Round and Round the Garden, they created lists for a picnic and made friends for the teddy using transient art. 
