

We would like to be able to communicate with the teachers without the children see- ing what we have written.	 We have set up Year group emails which will go directly to the teachers. These will only be available during this time and should be only be limited to questions about home learning. For all other queries, please use the school email
Work set gets lost in the pages of the jour- nal. We spend ages scrolling through a lot of stuff.	 All teachers will set work via the Activity section of the app. This will be set daily and work will be dated clearly to show when it was set. It will make it clear if it is daily or weekly work. At the end of every week, the work will be archived so every Monday, there will be a fresh start for everyone. If you still want to add work after this time, please let the teacher know and they can unarchive it temporarily.
My child often spends most of the day trying to keep up with all of the work set. We don't have time to do any fun things. My child is overwhelmed with the amount of work.	 Teacher do put more than enough work on there to help manage the children's abilities and speed in which they work. The expectation is that the English and Maths works should take them about an hour a day. On a Friday, we will not be setting additional English and Maths work. This will be a day to catch up on any missed work and to have time to complete the weekly topic activities set.

Other Changes To Be Made

• The adults really love to see all of the other things the children have been up to during the week. However, responding to these each day us taking up a lot of time so we request that you only upload these on a Friday now please unless it is part of a challenge.

If I can't get access to Seesaw...

If you would like your child to access Seesaw, please let us know. It is accessible from any device although the feedback has been that a laptop works better. However, phones and tablets can also work.

If you are unable to access Seesaw, but would still like your child to complete some learning at home, we are now unable to provide new packs for you. I am hoping that in the coming weeks, the new website will be finished so that we can then add some suggestions of learning on there. Watch this space! In the meantime, I have attached at the end of this newsletter the list of free websites which I collated when the school closed and sent out previously. There are many more free sites out there so please do search around.
