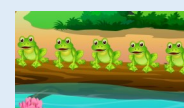
Rhythm and Rhyme Time

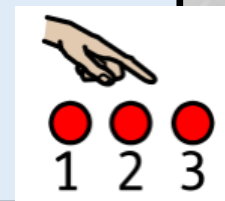


Being able to look at a group of objects and knowing how many are there.

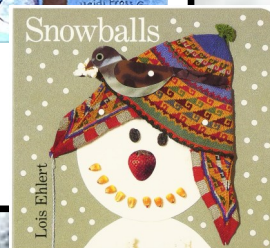

Lovely Ladybirds (2's)

- Join in with songs, rhymes copying sounds rhythm tune and tempo.
- Listen to simple stories and understand what is happening
- Understand and respond to questions e.g. Who? What? Where?
- Develop pretend play.
- Explore natural materials.
- Tear/rip – Develop their manipulation and control.
- Clap and Stamp to music.
- Gain control – kick, crawl, roll, catch balls, run, jump, climb.



Core Books for all!

These stories are language rich and full of adventure. The stories support children's development of rhythm and rhyme. We will be exploring the season Winter and spark the children's natural curiosities. Their repetitive nature supports children to join in and retell. The exciting events will help develop children's own pretend play and they offer opportunities to discuss the characters and their actions.



Clever Crickets and Brilliant Butterflies (3/4's)

- Enjoy listening to longer stories and remember what happens
- Answer "Why" questions.
- Develop their vocabulary and speak in full sentences.
- Use one handed tools e.g. scissors
- Skip, hop and balance on one leg.
- Use all their senses to engage with hands on exploration.
- Develop complex stories using small world.
