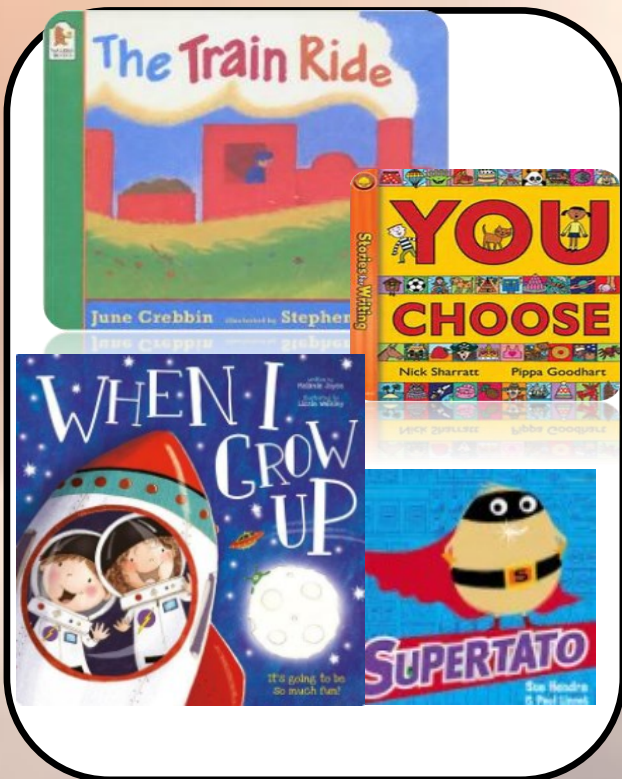

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## Fantastic Frogs and Busy Bees

- Beat Baby

A fun and musical session where the children explore rhythm, beat, rhyme and a variety of sounds.

- Tummy Time

We will be building our core and upper arm strength to music.

- Number Rhumba

Exploring numbers to 5 using Nursery Rhymes. Comparing quantities using words 'more' and 'less'.

We will begin to use language of size and categorise objects.

- Story Time

The children will explore the core texts to develop their listening skills, learn new words and ask questions.

## Delightful Dragonflies and Clever Crickets

- Rhyme Time

A fun session exploring rhyme, oral blending and a variety of sounds.

- Jigsaw (PSED)

This term our theme is Relationships. Learning how to make friends, be a good friend, to respect, be kind and help others.

- Number Rhumba

Comparing groups and Separating groups of objects in different ways. Matching quantity to numeral for numbers to 5 and extending to 10.

Use positional language.

- Story Time

Join in with stories, focus attention and listen to others in small group discussions. To retell, broaden vocabulary and ask questions.

## The Big Sing

**This is a chance for each group to get together and sing some songs! We will be exploring story sacks and singing Nursery Rhymes. It is a chance for us to sing Happy Birthday to those that have celebrated that week.**
