#### Lovely Ladybirds (2's)

- Join in with songs, rhymes copying sounds rhythm tune and tempo.
- Listen to simple stories and understand what is happening
- Understand and respond to questions e.g. Who? What? Where?
- Develop pretend play.
- Explore natural materials.
- Tear/rip Develop their manipulation and control.
- Clap and Stamp to music.
  - Gain control kick, crawl, roll, catch balls, run, jump, climb.

## **Clever Crickets and Brilliant Butterflies (3/4's)**

- Enjoy listening to longer stories and remember what happens
- Answer "Why" questions.
- Develop their vocabulary and speak in full sentences.
- Use one handed tools e.g. scissors
- Skip, hop and balance on one leg.
- Use all their senses to engage with hands on exploration.
- Develop complex stories using small world.
- Develop their self-care skills putting their coat on, feeding themselves, toileting



Walking Through the Jungle is language rich and full of adventure. The story supports children's development of rhythm and rhyme. We will be exploring: different textures and patterns, types of animals, environments and animal sounds. We will go on our own adventures and explore the children's natural curiosities. The repetitive nature of the story supports children to join in and retell. The exciting events will help develop children's vocabulary, their own pretend play and offer opportunities to discuss the characters and their actions.
