Digraph - two letters that make one sound e.g. sh ai ee

Trigraph - three letters that make one sound e.g. igh ear air

Vowels - help 'stick' letters together to make words

Subitising - The ability to look at a small number of objects and recognise how many objects there are without needing to count.

Story Language - Next, after that, finally, suddenly, said, then, soon, once upon a time

Non-Fiction books


- We will also be looking at a range of Non-fiction books so we can learn about real life superheroes and how they help us in our daily lives
