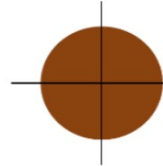

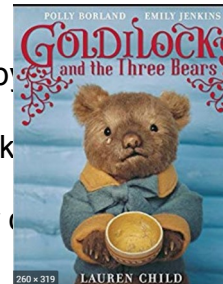
Listening, discussing and expressing views about a text.
